

**Minutes of Proceeding of the State Level Committee in the light of the order of National Green Tribunal, New Delhi in the Civil writ petition no-3727 of 1985 along with original application no-196 of 2014 to 481 of 2014-Krishankant Singh Vrs Ganga River Basin Authority and others held on 05.12.2014**

1	Constitution of State level committee.	State level committee has been constituted by Department of Forest & Environment, Govt. of Jharkhand vide notification no-3/Parya/pradu/(वाद)-16/2014/5158/वमम, Ranchi dated 01.12.2014
2	State level committee shall report jointly or severely to the Principal Committee. The committee would operate at the District level as well as the State level.	State Level Committee has been constituted. Action is being taken to report to Principal Committee.
3	The committee shall within a week, provide a comprehensive list of all the seriously water polluting industries in the State, which are directly or indirectly discharging their trade/industrial effluents into the River Ganga or its tributaries and are operating without consent of the Board, without effluent treatment plant or without anti pollution devices and are discharging untreated effluents.	Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board has uploaded a comprehensive list of all the seriously water polluting industries on the website of the Board and that of the Jharkhand Government. The committee discussed the status of the Koel River with regard to the tributaries of Ganga. It was revealed that River Koel is not a tributary of Ganga. Therefore the industries mentioned with reference to the Koel River may be omitted from the seriously polluting industries in list, uploaded on the website of Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board and that of Jharkhand Government.
4	The committee would ensure that proper criteria for identifying seriously water polluting is put on the website of the MoEF of the respective states, Central Pollution Control Board and the concerned State Pollution Control Boards. Determination of this aspect need not be quantity based but be quality based.	The criteria fixed by CPCB has been adopted by Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board and same has been uploaded on the website.
5	Regulatory authorities to issue guidelines in relation to the 'Zero discharge Units	In the State of Jharkhand, there is no Paper and Pulp industry, Sugar stand alone, Sugar-cum-distillery industries, Tanneries, Dyeing, Printing and organized/Designated slaughter houses discharging effluent in River Ganga or its tributaries. However, JSPCB has adopted the guidelines for zero discharge issued by National Ganga River Basin Authority and uploaded it on its website.
6	State Level Committee shall submit or cause to be submitted, drainage map of all the water polluting industries and industrial clusters within the jurisdiction of the State.	Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board has issued direction to polluting industries to submit the said drainage map within a month. The committee has decided to constitute a sub-committee under the chairmanship of Secretary, Urban Development Department, Representative of Industry Department & Jharkhand State Pollution Control Board as members to Prepare a Action Plan with regard to drainage map of all the water polluting industries and industrial clusters, possibly within three months.

	The State level Committee shall submit a separate plan specifying the points where the drains or direct discharge into River Ganga or its tributaries is identified.	All the 9 units of china clay mines and processing units located in the district of Sahibganj on the bank of River Ganga are closed at present. Action plan for industries located on River Damodar, a tributary of River Ganga will be prepared by the committee formed above.
8	State Level Committee to identify the points where the CETPs/ETPs can be installed on the drains and nallas, where the join River Ganga or any of its tributaries.	Action is being taken to identify the points where CETPs/ETPs can be installed. Regional Office, Dhanbad has been deputed to prepare a report. It has been decided that the above committee will identify the points where the CETPs/ETPs can be installed on the drains and nallas, where they join River Ganga or any of its tributaries and they will be implemented by the respective industry under CSR activity. This will be done under over all supervision of the Industry Department.
9	All industries in these States, carrying on the activities of Tannery, Paper and Pulp, Sugar stand alone, Sugar-cum-Distillery, Dyeing, Printing and Slaughter Houses, which are:- (a) Discharging their untreated industrial/Trade effluents directed or indirectly into the River Ganga and/or any of its tributaries; (b) Operating without consent of the concerned Boards; and (c) Have not installed any ETP or any requisite pollution control devices; Shall be directed to stop their business/industrial activity forthwith and not permitted to operate, in any manner whatsoever, except with the specific order of this Tribunal which shall be complied with without delay and default. If necessary, the Committees, Boards and all other concerned Authorities shall seal the premises of such units.	In the state of Jharkhand there is no Tannery, Paper & Pulp, Sugar stand alone, Sugar-cum-Distillery, Dyeing, Printing and slaughter Houses on the River Ganga or its Tributary.
